GENERAL RULES – UPDATED AUGUST 08

- 5mph speed limit at all times when on the site in any vehicle
- All anglers / visitors on the site must report to the office.
- All anglers must be in possession of a valid ticket and Environment Agency rod licence before setting up to fish anywhere on the site
- Use of the site and all facilities are at your own risk.
- Tickets are not transferable.
- Anglers must at all time use the appropriate car park. Parking is at the anglers own risk and PVF do not accept responsibility for losses or damage to the vehicle or anything therein.
- Anglers may not reserve pegs in any way
- The company reserve the right to order all fishing to stop at any time, to restrict access to any part of the lake, to cancel or refuse tickets without making a refund to the ticket holder.
- If an angler has to leave site for any reason we do not issue refunds.
- We reserve the right to search vehicles and possessions.
- Dogs are not allowed on the site.

FLY FISHING

- Barbless hooks must be used for catch and release.
- All nets must be dipped before fishing commences.
- Double and treble hooks are not permitted. Spinning is not allowed.
- Only natural or artificial fly fishing is allowed.
- Brown trout must be returned live to the water during 1st October and 14th March.
- Only one brown trout is allowed per bag (when in season)
- Anglers catching their limit must change to Barbless or de-barbed hooks.
- Fish must not be gutted on the premises.
- All juniors under the age of 15 must be supervised by an adult
- Any angler staying over their time will be asked to pay a minimum of £2.50
- Anglers caught with more fish than their limit may be prosecuted and barred.
- Badly damaged or bleeding fish must be killed and handed into the office.
- All anglers are asked to sign in and out after any fishing session

FISHING RULES

- All nets must be dipped before fishing commences.
- Damaged, dangerous and cordoned off pegs must not be used.
- Wading is not permitted at any time.
- Litter must be placed in the bin provided on site.
- Open and disposable barbecues must not be used
- Nuisance behaviour will not be tolerated & will result in a ban

COARSE FISHING

- **NO LEADCORE OR SIMILAR LEADERS**
- Double or treble hooks are not allowed.
- Children under the age of 11 years of age must be supervised.
- A maximum of three rods per angler is permitted.
- Klin-ik or a similar product should be used as required.
- Any ill or damaged fish must be reported to the office immediately.
- Carp anglers must have a large landing net and a substantial unhooking mat
- Carp anglers must use free running rigs (safe rigs).
- Nuts and un-soaked particle baits are banned.
- Trout pellets are banned.
- Please let a member of the Pendle View staff know if you want to move to a different peg.
- Double pegs are for the use of overnight anglers only.
- **Barbless hooks must be used at all times.**
- If an angler leaves their peg their lines must be taken out of the water.
- Live baiting is not permitted.
- Spinning is not permitted
- Keep nets are only allowed on the match lake during club angling matches
- Keep nets are allowed on the main lake but all fish over 2lb must be returned to the water.
- Anglers must not leave their rods unattended, EVER!
- We ask that all anglers call into the office before they leave to give us feedback on their catches. This is secured by a £1 deposit which is returned when you report your success.
- Carp anglers who catch large carp are allowed to sack up for a maximum of 30 minutes whilst they seek verification from an accredited bailiff.
- Overnight fishermen who catch a significant fish (over 30lbs), which needs verified are asked to contact the Fisheries Superintendent by telephone 07984 865560 /or 01254 822208 stating your peg number.
- All anglers are asked to sign in and out after any fishing session
